RED: "Too many tunes to tell you about, been away too long. Start off with a promising new record label called Trouble on Vinyl, 2 tunes out at mo, best one Here Comes Trouble ep definitely drum and bass stylee. Back to the Nuthouse on Plastic Surgery one boomin tune with a wicked bassline (personal favourite). Rolling Energy on Dark Horse Records, a label to watch. Wicked, wicked piece of vinyl by Techno Brewster & DJ Iceman called the 'Jungle Junkie' (b side best) Foul Play Vol. 3 on Moving Shadow remixes of their Vol. 2, well carried out. Kemical Kids - Grim ep 4 tracks, 2 are dark and 2 on the more lighter jumpin' tip. Mc Lethal new Vinyl with 2 bad mice remix, 3 tracks happy and uplifting. X Project track called Alpha a good vibe tune that grows on you. Miranda II by DJ Phantasy, what more can I say. F Project - Wise Ones ep another jumpin' track with some dark noises. G Spot Records - witness the B-line a track for the happy massive. The noise engineer has resurfaced with a new piece of vinyl called music and dancing from a far off galaxy, watch out for it. Finish off with a track thats a few weeks old but still kickin' it, Mega City 2 - London to Essex in 3 hours". 0702 469140

DUBRUNNER: "The latter part of March turned out to be another good time for tracks with the summer feeling shining through. I'll kick off my selection with the superb 'Spice of Life' on 'U No Dat', 'Ode to a Dead Man' supplied by 'Soapbar' and the great 'Sandman' all leading the way in the uplifting groove. 'Adrenalin's' 'Sub Oscilator' merges techno, ragga, and uplift in 4 good tracks. 'Swift & Zlnc' fuse darkness and impact while Secret Squirrels 'A D Flex' proves ragga need not be moody, wicked track. The dark half of me rates Uncle 22s 'Alfully Dark' and the excellent new 'Higher Octave' ep from Pro One Records, together with the Q-Bass remix of 'Vertigo', 'Liquid Alien vol.1' and Andy C's superb 'Bass Logic' ep on promo at the moment. Red Hot vinyl to look forward to includes the new 'D'Cruze' 12", Cool Hand Flex's latest adventure on In Touch Records and 'Aztec'. Signing off with my track of the month 'Obsession' from Donovan 'Bad Boy' Smith. Check It!!" 0850 410307

FRENZIC: "Kickin off this month with my current fave which is 'Testify' by Slipmaster J and DJ Leagle, bounciest toon I've heard for a long time. The 2 Dope ep by Bizzy B and Peshay is strictly for the headstrong massive, also by Peshay coming out in a few weeks is a track called Catch which is simply ruff, so check it out. Mega City 2 which has revamped 'Let Me Love You For Tonight' has the makings of a massive track. So too has the Year of the Ladies ep from 3rd Party Records. Skratch the Beat is the next release on Vinyl Rhythm Records due out soon and is set to be as big as the first 2. From Suburban Base This month we have Rap & Aston, Phuture Assassins and the Sub Plates which are all set to be big so check 'em out. Lucky Spin are putting out some good vinyl at the moment such as the new DJ Trace and Ed rush toon (Don Badman) which is a must for all fully pledged ravers. The final four of my selection this month are W4 on Formation records, Demon's Theme on Good Looking Records, Feeling Horny on Jack in the Box and last of all Citadel of Chaos 4 on Bombastic Plastic" 0702 344384

LTJ BUKEM

WE BRING YOU AN EXCLUSIVE INTERVIEW WITH A MAN LIKE LTJ BUKEM AND A WORD ON THE LYRICAL MASTER MC CONRAD. LETS GET DOWN TO THE NITTY GRITTY...

When did you start DJing?

Nine years ago when I was sixteen, at Reggae and Soul Dances. When I was 19/20 I started mixing Hip Hop and soul, from there I got into rave in the summers of 88/89. But I started playing out as Bukem in 1990 at Gullivors Nightclub, Confusions.

What was your first big break?

Raindance in June/July of 1990, I got a lot of work from this break.

How do you get your work now?

I am signed up with an agency, Groove Connection, I get all my work through my agent. What do you see yourself pursuing?

I will always want to DJ, I can never see myself stopping. I also want to produce tracks, but not necessarily rave. When it comes down to it I am a soul person, that's what makes me move. I could see myself making beaty soul tracks on the Galliano, Tribe Called Quest kind of vibe. I am not into the noise aspect of rave and you can only do so much with it, the music itself can go on forever you know the vocal, bassline and string.

How many records have you made to date?

Three records which have been released. But there are loads of tracks I haven't brought and loads on computer. I put some on plate to get a reaction from the public, then I go from there.

What do you think of the changing of the scene? Since situations change, what you can do and what you can't do has changed. You have a split in the music, you've got the house/garage at roughly 120 bpm and your rave at 150 bpm. All this labelling of rave is rubbish, people say Jungle Music etc. A good tune is a good tune.

Do you buy house/garage?

Yes, I buy as much garage as I do Hardcore, nuff samples

Do you play house/garage out?

Yes I have played a few garage sets out but I would like to do more.

What are your views on the amount of DJs out there?

Everyone seems to be a DJ. It's not a problem, it keeps you on your toes. It does wonders for Technics sales!

Why do you think there are low attendance levels at some raves?

It's a combination of things. One is money and life. The production of raves has gone downhill in a lot of cases i.e. two-bit systems. It's funny how when you go to a rave, 9 times out of ten the lighting is always right. You couldn't go to a rave and just look at the lights.

How do you see the music progressing?

Music is always progressing as long as it is inputting original ideas. Rave music won't progress if producers just keep on sampling everyone elses tracks. There's a million and one vocal, bass sounds, strings etc that haven't been used, why not use them!

Who do you rate on the circuit DJ wise?

Peshay, Groove Connections Boys - Rolling, Tayla, Randall, Simon Bassline Smith, DJ Ron, Ray Kieth, Mr C, Eddie Richards, Trace, Donavon Bad Boy Smith etc I could mention a lot more. . . I rate every DJ out there who's trying to do a thing, in that respect I respect everyone for doing it without them there wouldn't be a scene. There are thousands of DJs who you never hear but their mixing abilities are excellent, respect for the bedroom boys.

What producers do you rate?

I rate those producers who sit down for more than a few hours an think about what there doing. There are a lot of people making a lot of illogical, meaningless tunes.

Do you have any plans to go abroad?

I have no set dates but I would like to go back to Australia. I have played in Greece, Spain, Australia and Switzerland.

Do you think our scene has influenced other countries?

Yes they want our DJs therefore, they must be influenced. Also half the countries are using the names of our raves e.g. Dreamscape is used in Switzerland and Australia, Fantazia. . I could go on!

Where do you prefer to play in Britain?

What makes a good night out for me is a well set up sound system. If I am somewhere with Sturdy decks, 2 crisp monitors, a loud and well set up sound system north, south, east or west, it doesn't matter that's a good night for me.

Where did you meet Conrad?

Two Christmases ago at a rave in slough. I was playing I heard him scratchin with his mouth so I asked him to play out with me. Conrad is good he knows when to shut up, too many MCs go on glory missions, Conrad compliments my set.

Does Conrad go everywhere with you?
When he can be bothered to get out of bed!



What MCs do you rate?

Conrad. I haven't heard a lot but anyone thats got anything sensible to say I appreciate.

Where is the best place you've ever played? There are several places I have walked away thinking that was wicked. But one of the most recent was Universe at Newport last year, the production was excellent.

Where do you go to buy records?

Most of the shops around the M25 region and Basement Records in Reading.
